"Draping is an intuitive process. It's about listening to the material and following the flow of its expression." – Christine Mayer.

Draping is the process of positioning and pinning fabric on a dress form to develop the structure of a garment design. Working in three dimensions. After draping, the fabric is removed from the dress form and used to create the flat sewing pattern for the garment.

March 20, 2025 1:00-4:00 pm:

Two part demonstration:

- 1. Basic principles of draping described and modeled with muslin on the dress form
 - a. Marking onto the muslin for pattern preparation
 - b. Walk-thru transferring marking to paper pattern
- 2. Free draping using garments to create a new wearable art
 - a. Draping and pinning
 - b. Removing from dress form in preparation for sewing machine
